#### **GRANT CATEGORIES:**

#### **MEETING IMMEDIATE NEEDS**

These grants ensure that people's basic needs (like shelter and healthcare) are met. They also guarantee that case management efforts and wraparound services are available to get people back on stable financial ground.

#### **BUILDING RESILIENCE**

School readiness is vital to long-term success.

We fund programs for children that maintain and improve their academic performance and get them reading by third grade. We also fund skill-building programs for adults.



Midlands Reading Consortium (MRC) is a literacy-based program that helps increase the number of children reading at grade level at the start of fourth grade. United Way of the Midlands, together with elementary schools across Richland, Lexington, Fairfield, Calhoun, and Orangeburg counties, trains volunteers to read one-on-one with students throughout the school year and helps children in the program build reading comprehension, literacy, and vocabulary skills.

"Just 30 minutes of your time every week can change the landscape of lives by helping a child cultivate a love for reading and building their confidence in meeting target classroom goals," said Dr. Jabari Bodrick, Senior Director, Education & Resiliency.

Recently, a STEM component was added to six of our MRC schools. It follows the STEM Learning Ecosystem approach to preparing our youth for the global economy through fun, age-appropriate STEM afterschool engagements and programming.



To help solve the challenge of affordable housing for educators, United Way of the Midlands has invested \$600,000 toward The Village, a community that prioritizes homes for certified teachers.

"We recognize the critical role that affordable housing plays in ensuring teacher retention and the overall success of our schools," said Sara Fawcett, President & CEO of United Way of the Midlands. "By investing in [The Village], we are taking a proactive approach to address the housing challenges faced by educators."

The Village will provide 16 three-bedroom homes with affordable rents (additional homes are planned for a future phase). It will be the first residential teacher community in South Carolina and likely will serve as a model for teacher retention in rural areas in the state and beyond.

A college education is vital to long-term financial health. In South Carolina, only 16% of Black men have a bachelor's degree compared to almost 31% of all adults. In partnership with Colonial Life, United Way is guaranteeing resilience—and brighter futures—for young men through a dynamic new workforce development initiative called Young Men United (YMU).

YMU is an evidence-informed initiative designed to create barrier-free pathways for young men to reach their academic and career goals starting in the tenth or eleventh grade. With individualized support and guidance, the program supports participants through high school graduation, into and through their chosen post-secondary pathway, and supports their transition from their post-secondary pathways to the workforce.
